How to Create a Multi-Strand Necklace Class

Saturday, May 25, 2024 1:30pm to 3:30pm New Mexico Bead Company, 4111 Louisiana Blvd NE, Albuquerque, NM

Anna Holland will teach how to finish a multi-strand necklace.

Cost for the class is \$15. This includes two 3-inch pieces of 16-gauge sterling silver wire and 15 sterling silver twisted crimps.

Students need to bring:

- Your favorite stringing wire, enough for 7 strands of beads. Each strand of wire should be at least 20 inches long, depending on how long you want your finished necklace to be (you want to have 5 inches of wire on each end of the beaded sections). You should pre-string your 7 strands in order to save time in class.
- Clamps or tape to secure the strands you've strung.
- 2 silver cones wide enough at the base to accommodate the 7 strands of your necklace
- Silver clasp
- 2 pair of needle nose pliers
- Round nose pliers
- Crimping tool

To make it easy, the beads you're stringing should be 6mm to 8mm. Again, you'll need enough of those beads to string 7 strands. Anna will have some beads with her if you can't find the right size. If you're working on a particular project and the beads are larger, that's ok. Anna will have what you'll need to make the adjustment.

Turquoise Bead Challenge

Turquoise is used and admired around the world. Part of the allure of turquoise is knowing where your gemstone beads came from – Mexico, China, the Middle East (Iran, Afghanistan), the United States, or elsewhere. For this challenge, create jewelry using your favorite turquoise.

Keep in mind that, if desired, you can have the jewelry you created for this challenge offered for sale at the BSNM booth during the Turquoise United Symposium in August 2024.

There is no kit for this challenge.

Rules:

- **1.** All submissions must be completed by you prior to the June 21, 2024 BSNM general meeting and after the June 2023 meeting.
- **2.** You may create a piece of jewelry (necklace, bracelet, or earrings) or a set of jewelry (such as necklace and earrings, bracelet and earrings, or necklace and bracelet).
- **3.** At least 50% of the finished project must be turquoise (the stone, not just the color) incorporated into the design.
- 4. You must identify the country of origin for the turquoise used in your design (and the mine it came from, if known) on a card that accompanies your finished project.
- **5.** Your **finished project must be brought to the June 2024 general meeting** where members will vote on the entries.
- **6.** Judging will be based on creativity in presentation and materials, and mastery in craftsmanship. Judging will also be based on how closely the entries followed the rules. Prizes will be awarded!

Happy beading and good luck with the challenge! Try to use this challenge to broaden your beading horizons. Learn something new or try something different!

Helping Hands Lift Up Pursonalities Plus ABQ

Amanda received two purses over two years in a recovery program. The gifts nearly overwhelmed her. As a mother of five (two with special needs) in an abusive relationship, Amanda was not used to receiving anything for herself, let alone a gift filled with hope.

Today, Amanda speaks with other women about recovery. When she met with volunteers for Pursonalities Plus ABQ, there was not a dry eye when she finished.

Pursonalities Plus ABQ sees every woman who has chosen a road of recovery from domestic violence, sexual assault, trafficking, homelessness, and incarceration as able to find a thriving and fulfilling life.

The gift of a filled purse is a tool to help women in recovery reclaim their dignity. The small 501(c)(3) staffed by volunteers, partners with 33 organizations to give gifts of gently used purses filled with new toiletries. Each purse contains a packet of jewelry – a bracelet, necklace, and pair of earrings in cellophane. The purses are tied off with a scarf and a scripture

Volunteers have affirmed their belief that each purse is filled with faith, hope, empowerment, joy, love, and connection; in short, the purse has a personality!

You can help with your donation of gently used or new costume jewelry, especially bracelets. All jewelry packets are curated by the volunteers so they offer something special for the recipients. If you prefer to donate gently used purses or scarves, or new toiletries, those are most welcome as well.

April Meeting Recap

Melody MacDuffee had our rapt attention as she talked about how she became involved with beadmakers in Ghana (they happened upon her contact info in an issue of Bead&Button magazine and sent her an email). She described meeting with female elders (referred to as "queens") to get permission to set up her bead-making center. When these elders realized that Melody truly wanted to help their people, they performed a ceremony with Melody so that she also was recognized as a "queen" and was given an African name. The Ghanaian beadmakers still make their recycled glass beads to sell, but also incorporate those beads into jewelry and bead-and-wire animals that Melody helps them sell. Melody's non-profit organization, Soul of Somanya (named for the region), provides higher-than-average wages to its workers mostly young women who may not have other opportunities for employment.

After Melody's presentation, members could purchase a variety of beads. The hardest part was choosing which ones to buy!

Fri., Sat., & Sun., May 17, 18, & 19, 2024 10:00am - 5:00pm each day (3-day workshop)

I always think about that incredible creative process that engages the mind and translates to our hands. This book is dedicated to the hands all over the world who keep things moving, beautiful, functioning, living, and so much more.



In this workshop we will create an 8½" x 11½" cloth book with 10 beautiful, removable pages representing hands. Pamela has selected a collection of fabrics to create this book along with a selection of hand images for you to use. We will embellish our pages with trims, beads and charms. Pamela will show you an easy beaded-edge technique to embellish your book edges. The cover of the book has an 8"x4" metal hand which represents the contents of the book. Each participant will trace their hand on a provided heavy weight paper to give to each person in class. The book will have a pocket for these "hands of friendship."

Workshop cost: \$330 plus a \$30 kit fee for 3-day workshop. Deposit of \$100 and workshop registration form is due by April 15, 2024 to hold your place. Balance of \$230 is due May 1, 2024. Material list will be sent to you once you register.

"Rust Never Sleeps" a mixed media workshop with Cynthia Leespring

Sat.-Sun., July 27-28, 2024 10:00am – 4:00pm both days (2-day workshop)



Spend the weekend creating a double-sided, 5-page book honoring the natural power of rust and patina. Learn techniques for making pockets, tags, inserts and fold outs using images, fibers, rusted items, and even dry wall tape.

Cynthia is a Northern New Mexico artist who has created in many media, but she always comes back to fiber and paper. Her art centers on her interests in history, nature, magic, women, and her favorite muse, the Moon.

Workshop cost: \$225 plus a \$20 kit fee for 2-day workshop. Deposit of \$100 and workshop registration form is due by June 15, 2024 to hold your place. Balance of \$145 is due July 1, 2024. Material list will be sent to you once you register.

Emerald - Gem of May

A variety of beryl, emerald is the birthstone for May. Due to their rarity, emeralds are often considered more valuable than diamonds. The world's finest emeralds, those of dark green color, are found in Columbia in a dark bituminous (tar-bearing) limestone. Emeralds of good quality are found in Africa and near Sverdlovsk in Russia.

As a gem of spring, the emerald is the symbol of those qualities associated with this season: youth, hope, immortality, truth, love, faithfulness, healing, and the waxing moon.

In ancient times emeralds were believed to aid the eyesight and heal diseases of the eye. Traditionally it is the gem of "far seeing" and of divination and prophecy.


May 21 – Space Day –


