Wire Weaving Class

Saturday, April 23, 2022 1:00 pm to 5:00 pm
Mama's Minerals, 800 20th St NW, Albuquerque

Diane Castillo will teach this wire weaving class. She is the owner and jeweler for DTC Southwest Designs. Diane has been designing unique, artistic jewelry for over 10 years. Her work combines a blend of intricate wire weaving and the use of gemstones and beads to accentuate the full artistic expression of each piece.

Have you ever wanted to try out wire weaving? Or have you thought about how wire weaving might add to your existing artistic talents? This 2-hour basic wire weaving class will cover types and characteristics of wire (including how/where to purchase), followed by practice in two basic wire-weaving techniques (coil, 3-2 weave, and variations), and the creation of a silver wire-weave heart pendant with an amethyst round, which participants will take home. If time allows, additional weave patterns will be practiced. Instructor will demonstrate and provide in a step-by-step directions and written instructions will be provided. Examples of other weave patterns will be shown in completed works by the instructor, some available for purchase. This class is for the beginner and assumes little to no knowledge of wire work.

Class fee: \$65.


Kit fee: \$20. Kit includes enough wire to practice weaves and patterns and to complete one heart pendant with amethyst round bead (and enough to complete 2nd heart pendant without bead at home). (If participants choose to purchase materials rather than kit, please bring to class one packet of 20-gauge dead-soft silver-plated wire; one packet of 26-gauge dead-soft silver-plated wire; and one 4mm drilled round bead.)

Students need to bring: Flat needle-nose pliers (not ridged); round-nose pliers; wire cutters (instructor will bring extra); small scissors; flat **12" ruler**; small cotton cloth (wash cloth or scrap t-shirt). Optional: metal file.

Class size is limited. **Masks are required.**

If you prefer, you can make the necklace using 4 strands of size 8 seed beads. The ends of the strands are made with sparkling and interesting beads to compliment the color of each strand such as bugle beads, twisted bugles, 4mm crystals in any shape, etc., and teardrops for the bottom of the strands. Nan has a good supply of silver-tone and gold-tone leaf toggles you can buy for \$2 each. The leaf has a small loop at the opposite end from the large loop to attach 6 strands using the same beads you use for the ends of the long strands for double the fun at the bottom of the lariat when you wear it!</p> <p>Class size is limited.</p>



Nan Card has recently finished this Corfu Bracelet designed by Ann Benson and kitted by Beads East of Manchester, CT. Her sister, Diana Card, gave her this kit for Christmas 2015. Recently, Nan was looking for something to do and grabbed the kit from her stash and got down to work. This is a beadpoint project, which is beading on needlepoint canvas. The pattern is color-stamped onto the canvas (as opposed to hand-painted canvasses) and the beading is done in size 15 seed beads. There are also 4mm bicones and sequin-and-bead features in the paisley pattern. The center feature is a dyed stone cabochon with a peyote capture and picot edging; this is then sewn onto the beads of the bracelet. Nan did a set of three snaps for a secure closure that maintains the shape of this wide cuff bracelet.

Gem of the Month – Tiger's-Eye

Tiger's-eye (also called tiger eye or tigers eye) is a name given to a group of stones with a special luminous quality in their structure. They are basically quartz (silicon dioxide), but they have formed in an unusual way: fibers of the mineral crocidolite (a type of asbestos mineral) have been laid down in parallel bands within the quartz structure. This creates a silky-looking shimmer effect when the stone is turned to the light – **resembling a cat's eye**. During the replacement process (pseudomorphism), the iron within the crocidolite dissolves and stains the quartz, thereby providing the golden-yellow to brown color of the tiger's-eye.

Tiger's-eye is a hard stone and, like most quartz minerals, can be carved. A wonderful way to appreciate the light effects in this stone is to see a large piece in a polished sphere. The undulating, contrasting bands of color and luster make for an attractive motif and it is mainly used for jewelry-making and ornamentation. Tiger's-eye cabochons are very popular ring stones and are used in pins, earrings, pendants, and many other jewelry items. They are one of the most common stones used in men's rings and cufflinks. This stone is also frequently cut into beads for use in necklaces and earrings. Stones with a light honey color are especially popular.

Most tiger's-eye used as a gemstone is naturally amber to brown in color. The original crocidolite is a bluish-gray color, and sometimes the pseudomorphism to quartz is incomplete. When this happens, the result is a stone with a bluish-gray color (and often with streaks or overtones of brown or yellow), but still with cat's eye effect. This type of material is known as hawk's-eye or **blue tiger's-eye**. Blue tiger's-eye is much rarer than yellow (or golden) **tiger's-eye**. The blue form in its natural state is not common, and if you do find it, you will usually see the brown parts of the stone mixed in. Red and green, as well as some blue, **tiger's-eye** is treated with heat or dye to create the color. However, it could be argued that changes caused by heat happen **inside the earth anyway, and in the case of red tiger's-eye** it does not change the structure.

Tiger's-eye may form together with brownish-red or metallic-gray hematite, forming a stone known as tiger iron. Tiger iron is a popular ornamental material used in a variety of applications, from beads to cabochons to knife hilts.

Tiger's-eye has been a popular semiprecious stone for thousands of years. Tombs in the ancient city of Ur in Mesopotamia (modern Iraq) dating back to 2500 BCE have yielded gold set with agates, such as tiger's-eye and carnelian. The stone was also used in ancient Egypt. Since **Roman times**, **tiger's-eye** has been a traditional choice for carving signet rings with individual crests or emblems to be used as stamps for sealing wax. Roman soldiers wore engraved tiger's-eye to protect them in battle. It is still used as a stone of protection today. In some parts of the world, **tiger's-eye** is believed to ward off the evil eye.

Yellow tiger's-eye is linked to the energy of the solar plexus chakra, clearing mental blocks, and encouraging focus on current issues. Placed over the solar plexus or abdomen, the stone eases tension and protects from external influences.

Red tiger's-eye is warming and grounding, helping to **ease sluggishness and "winter blues."** In healing layouts, it is used on the abdomen, similar to yellow **tiger's-eye**.

Blue tiger's-eye soothes frontal headaches caused by mental stress and calms the system, easing anxiety. It also has a protective effect, shielding the aura from unwanted influences.

Tiger's-eye is a birthstone for the zodiac signs of Taurus (April 20 to May 20) and Gemini (May 21 to June 20)

Common sources of tiger's-eye include Australia, Burma, India, Namibia, South Africa, the United States, Brazil, Canada, China, Korea, and Spain. Tiger iron is mined primarily in South Africa and Western Australia.

Note: Many people are unclear if the name of this stone should be "tiger" or "tigers" or "tiger's," in addition to whether or not a hyphen is used. "Tiger's-eye" is how the name is spelled in ***Gemstones of the World*** by Walter Schumann, which is an authoritative book with the distinction of having more copies in print than any other book about gems. The stone also appears as "tiger's-eye" in Gemological Institute of America (GIA) course materials.

Museum of Beadwork Call for Entries

How it works: Each year we ask artists to contribute a beaded item of a specific theme. We install these collected items in an exhibition highlighting the power of people coming together for the purpose of community and creation. The exhibition is then on display for roughly a year. Once finished, the individual items are used in fundraising efforts for the Museum supporting the staff, development, and programs of this community-based institution.

The theme for this year is "Enter the Stars" and we would like you to make and send in a beaded star that will be part of an installation exhibit in our gallery entryway. Help us decorate this space with a sky of stars. It will be our opening year, and we want to highlight every one of you that made this opening possible as the stars you are.

We invite you, no matter your experience, style, or technique, to make a star and send it to us.

Guidelines:

- **Stars can be anywhere between 2" in any direction to 10" in any direction.**
- As the stars will be hung, 3-dimensional is best, but we are not discouraging 2D as long as they do not fold under their own weight.
- Use of an armature, framework, or solid structure to bead upon is acceptable.
- Each star needs to have a loop of material or jump ring at the top for them to be hung from.
- Found materials are acceptable but we ask that the stars are at least 70% beads.
- No color requirements.

- Original designs are preferred. It is up to the beader (you) to know whether a pattern you have purchased is donatable. Please also include the name of the designer so credit can be given where it is due.
- Feel free to send us as many as you like. In fact, the more the better!

Please mail them to us no later than May 1, 2022.

When mailing, please include:

- Your star(s).
- Your name, town/state/country, and age (if you wish to share).
- Whether or not you would like to be listed as a contributing artist.

The final installation will largely depend on how many individual stars we receive.

Being in the entryway, this will be the first exhibit that visitors will see when they enter the Museum and with your help, we plan to make it shine!!

All proceeds resulting from this project will go to support the Museum of Beadwork and its mission.




BSNM Financials Available on Website

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
